

Based on the student's feedback analysis for the year 2022-23, the following are the observations:



- Content of the syllabus of your course (4.4): This indicates that the content covered in the syllabus is highly rated, suggesting that it is comprehensive and relevant.
- **Time duration allotted for syllabus completion (4.3)**: This rating suggests that the time allocated for covering the syllabus is generally considered appropriate, neither too rushed nor too lengthy.
- Relevance of curriculum in upgrading of knowledge & understanding (3.9): This rating reflects that the curriculum is seen as relevant and valuable for enhancing knowledge and understanding.
- Enhancement of skill & competency (3.9): The curriculum is believed to effectively enhance skills and competencies among students.
- **Blending of theory & practical aspects (4.0)**: There seems to be a good balance between theoretical and practical components in the curriculum, which is often seen as beneficial for learning.
- Curriculum facilitates you in cognitive, social, and emotional growth (4.1): The curriculum is viewed as conducive to the cognitive, social, and emotional development of students.
- The curriculum has provision to engage students in the monitoring, review, and continuous quality improvement of the teaching-learning process (3.8): This suggests that there are mechanisms in place for involving students in improving the quality of teaching and learning.
- The Curriculum inculcates soft skills, life skills, and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work (3.9): The curriculum is perceived as including elements that prepare students with soft skills, life skills, and employability skills, which are essential for the job market.

- **Frequency of Curriculum revision (3.0)**: The curriculum's revision frequency is rated lower, indicating that it may not be updated as frequently as desired.
- Curriculum Delivery by teachers (4.1): Teachers are delivering the curriculum effectively, as indicated by this rating.
- Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes, and program outcomes (4.2): Teachers provide students with clear information about what is expected of them in terms of competencies, course outcomes, and program outcomes.
- Career & placement opportunities (3.53): The opportunities related to career and placement are rated moderately, suggesting that there may be room for improvement in this aspect.
- Classroom and laboratory facilities (4.2): This rating suggests that the classroom and laboratory facilities are of high quality, creating a conducive environment for teaching and learning.

#### Teachers Feedback Analysis Academic Year 2022-23


Teachers and faculty members at Christ College were contacted to gather insights about their programs. They were asked to share their thoughts on the curriculum, the flexibility to implement innovative teaching methods, the examination process, and their skill development using a structured questionnaire. The feedback was collected through Google Forms and sent to each teacher's institutional email address. The responses were evaluated using a five-point rating system, where a rating of 5 represented strongly Agree, 4 Agree, 3 Neutral, 2 Disagree and 1 denoted Strong Disagree.

Based on the teachers' feedback analysis for year 2022-23, the following are the observations:

- Teachers agreed to the fact that syllabus is updated with the latest advancements in the subject (score obtained is 4.1).
- Teachers completely approved that current syllabus is need based and is suitable to the course (scores obtained 4.4 and 4 respectively).
- Teachers admitted that appropriate sequencing of courses/contents is provided in the curriculum, similarly, aims, objectives and programmes outcome of the syllabi is well defined (scores obtained 3.7 and 3.9).
- Most of the teachers were pleased with the online class material provided and assures that course content is followed by corresponding reference material (score obtained 3.9).
- Teachers extremely appreciated the balance between the theory and application provided in the syllabus and besides teachers strongly agreed to the fact that the syllabus increases knowledge and brings better perspective in the subject area (scores obtained 3.5 and 4 respectively).
- It is also revealed that examinations are conducted well in time with proper coverage of all units in the syllabus (scores obtained 3.8).
- From teachers feedback obtained it is discovered that they have freedom to adopt new techniques/strategies of teaching such as seminar presentations, group discussions and learners' participations, likewise freedom to adopt/adapt new techniques/strategies of testing and assessment of students(internal) (scores obtained 4.6 and 4.5 respectively).
- From the feedback it is also observed that the books prescribed/listed as reference materials are relevant, updated and appropriate (scores obtained 4.1).

• Teachers agreed to the fact that currellum gives scope for employability (scores obtained 3.8).

Collecting feedback from the alumni is crucial for the success of every institution. All these feedbacks were analysed by using a five-point rating scale. The grade points are as follows:


- The maximum score is 5 and the minimum score is one

#### **Process & Submission:**

At the beginning of every academic year, the Alumni Engagement team prepares an online MCQ based feedback form for the recently graduated students and shares the same electronically. These forms are filled in by the Alumni online and responses are analysed. The feedback analysis is submitted to the Internal Quality Assurance Cell, for further discussions and decision making.

- **4.** The college has a positive and balanced academic atmosphere that enabled them to be successful in their life [3.94/5].
- **5.** The students / alumni are satisfied with the availability, accessibility and opportunity to refer various materials from the institution library[3.87/5].
- **6.** The Alumni are satisfied with various development activities organized by the college for overall development of the students [3.88/5].
- 7. It was observed that the institute should engage more in developing and incubating entrepreneurial activities and assistance for the students. Ability of the curriculum to foster entrepreneurship need to be improved [3.38/5].
- **8.** It was learnt that the academic initiatives taken by the college to improve student competence has been satisfactory [3.51/5]
- **9.** The Alumni feedback reveals that the institution supports higher learning and student progression for higher education [3.49/5].

Employers Feedback Analysis Academic Year 2022-23



Based on employers feedback analysis for year 2022-23, the following are the observations:

- Employer have highly appreciated the course employee completed in terms of practical learning and hence the score provided is 4.2.
- From employers feedback it is clear that, conceptual skills, analytical abilities and perceptions of employee can be attributed to the effective incorporation of these components into the curriculum of the course (score obtained 4.0).
- Employers decidedly accepted that curriculum is competent in the job sector (score obtained 4.1)
- The performance of employers in aptitude test and group discussion was extremely appreciated by employers (scores obtained 4.0 and 4.1 respectively).
- Employers firmly approved to the fact that employee has got excellent subject knowledge (scores obtained 4.2).
- From feedback it is clear that, technical Skill of the employee gained through curriculum and institution is adequate (scores obtained 4.2).
- It is detected that the curriculum aided in problem solving mentality and ability to innovate, additionally to these, the curriculum promotes leadership qualities also (scores obtained 4.2 and 3.9).
- Employers have agreed to the fact that, the curriculum of the course the employee completed has relevance to industrial needs (scores obtained 3.9).
- From the feedback obtained, it is observed that the curriculum is effective in developing innovative thinking (scores obtained 4.2).

• Employers have strongly agreed that the employee is aware of professional ethics and attitude, thereby the employee exhibits team work (scores obtained 4.4 and 4.5 respectively).
