Report

Session 1: Director's Address

The Faculty Induction Program at commenced with an inspiring and informative address by our esteemed Director, [Director's Name]. The Director's speech served as a motivating and insightful start to the program, setting the tone for the induction of our new faculty members.

Session 2: Dr. Jiji Johnson

Methodology of Assessments in CBSC Pattern as per SPPU guidelines

The College Exam Officer, Dr. Jiji Johnson, delivered an informative and engaging session to new faculty members. The session focused on the methodology of assessment in the CBSE (Central Board of Secondary Education) pattern as applied within Pune University.

Sessions Highlights:

1. Introduction to the Examination Cell of Christ College - Pune.

CEO introduced all the members of the exam cell and also mentioned the purpose and intention behind the cell.

2. Overview of CBSE Pattern:

The session commenced with an overview of the CBSE pattern and its significance within Pune University. She explained that this pattern is widely adopted in schools and colleges, and understanding its assessment methodology is essential for effective teaching.

3. Assessment Components:

CEO elaborated on the various components of assessment in the CBSE pattern (Internal and External), which typically include periodic tests, assignments, projects, practicals, and final examinations. They emphasized the need to balance formative and summative assessments.

4. Grading System:

The session delved into the grading system used in CBSE assessments, explaining the grading scale for evaluating student performance. The importance of providing constructive feedback to students was highlighted.

5. Continuous Assessment:

CEO stressed the concept of continuous assessment, where students are assessed throughout the academic year rather than relying solely on final examinations. The benefits of this approach, such as reducing exam stress and promoting a deeper understanding of subjects, were discussed.

6. Examination Formalities:

Examination form details were explained. The procedure for application was briefly explained. Roles and responsibilities of faculties during examinations and post exams were explained. Exam evaluation and grading details were explained and the University procedures were introduced as well.

7. Resources and Support:

Session 3: Mrs. Deepa Sujith

Activity Report

On 04 October 2022, Dr. Jose John CMI, the Principal of Scared Heart College, Thevara delivered an enlightening and thought-provoking session on "Quality Assurance and Its Importance" to the faculties of Christ College - Pune. The session aimed to provide insights into the significance of quality assurance in higher education and its role in fostering excellence.

Aims and Objectives:

- 1. To promote awareness of about significance of Quality Assurance
- 2. To foster a Quality Culture
- 3. To encourage continuous improvement
- 4. To orient on the Quality assurance process.

Learning Outcomes:

- 1. Understanding and gaining knowledge of Quality Assurance
- 2. Alignment with Institutional Goals
- 3. Practical application of Quality Assurance principles within one's on academic roles and Departments.

Number of Participants: 30 participants

Session Agenda:

1. Defining Quality Assurance (QA):

The session began by defining quality assurance in the context of higher education. QA was described as a systematic process that ensures educational institutions maintain and improve the quality of their programs, services, and outcomes.

2. Importance of Quality Assurance:

Session emphasized the critical role of quality assurance in higher education institutions. They highlighted that QA is essential for:

- Meeting accreditation and regulatory requirements.
- Enhancing institutional reputation.
- Ensuring student satisfaction and success.
- Promoting continuous improvement in teaching, research, and administration.

3. QA Frameworks and Practices:

The session delved into various QA frameworks and practices commonly used in higher education, such as program evaluations, peer reviews, and self-assessment processes. He discussed the benefits of adopting these approaches for institutional growth.

Dr. Jose also presented the QA Framework of Sacred Heart College, Tewara for better understanding of the faculties. Each criteria's were clearly mentioned and explained.

4. Components of a Quality Assurance System:

The session outlined the key components of a comprehensive QA system, including:

- Curriculum development and review.
- Teaching and learning assessment.
- Faculty development and support.
- Student feedback mechanisms.
- Assessment of administrative processes.
- External quality evaluations.

5. Alignment with Institutional Goals:

The session stressed the importance of aligning QA efforts with the institution's mission, vision, and strategic goals. It was emphasized that QA should be integrated into the institution's culture and practices.

6. Continuous Improvement:

Dr. Jose highlighted the concept of continuous improvement as a central tenet of QA. Faculty members were encouraged to view QA as an opportunity for growth and innovation in their teaching, research, and administrative roles.

7. **Q&A** and Discussion:

The session concluded with an engaging Q&A session, allowing faculty members to seek clarifications, share insights, and discuss their experiences related to quality assurance.

3. Conclusion



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
