ACTIVITY REPORT

Objectives:

- 1. To improve the quality of teaching and learning experiences in the classroom through innovative pedagogical techniques, technology integration, and active learning strategies.
- 2. To provide opportunities for faculty to acquire new skills, certifications, and advanced degrees that can contribute to their professional growth and development.
- 3. To enhance faculty abilities to provide guidance, mentorship, and support to students in their academic and career pursuits.

Report:

A successful four-day Faculty Development Program focusing on "Leveraging Moodle in a Culturally Diverse Classroom; Strategies for Effective Teaching" took place at Christ College-Pune, running from June 12th to June 15th, 2018. The program garnered an enthusiastic response, drawing 25 participants from the Departments of Commerce, Science, Management and Arts.

During his welcoming address, Principal Dr. (Fr.)Sony Chundattu conveyed his perspective to the attending faculty members. He emphasized that participating in such faculty development programs could significantly enhance both faculty and student development. Fr. Chundattu stressed that these programs contribute to practical teaching skills and help faculty members improve their teaching performance. Furthermore, he underscored the significance and goals of organizing faculty development programs, offering insight into the selected FDP topics and their relevance.

Day 1 - As the new academic year commenced, an orientation program for faculty members, centered on the theme of "Education and Its Diverse Demands," was led by Fr. Joy Puthussery CMI, the Chairman of Carmel Vidyabhavan Trust and the manager of Christ College Pune. In his address, he invoked Albert Einstein's words, stating, "Everybody is a genius, but if you judge a fish by its ability to climb a tree, it will live its whole life believing that it is stupid." Father emphasized the importance of recognizing that a uniform approach doesn't cater to the unique needs of all students. He encouraged teachers to consider whether they are adequately preparing students for the future while adhering to principles and rules. Father also urged teachers to work collaboratively as a unified community, as he believed that extraordinary outcomes could emerge from such cooperation. The program served as an inspiration for teachers to adopt a high-quality approach in order to find solutions to the challenges of the present day.





Day 2 – On the second day, Dr. (Fr.) Lijo Thomas CMI from Christ University Bangalore, explained the educational approach that focuses on defining specific learning outcomes and objectives for educational programs, courses and activities. Outcome-Based Education (OBE) for Faculty Development Programs (FDP) is a learner-centric approach aimed at equipping educators with the knowledge, skills, and strategies required to excel in today's dynamic educational landscape. This approach emphasizes clear and measurable learning outcomes, ensuring that faculty members can effectively deliver high-quality education and continuously improve their teaching practices.





Day 3 - Dr. (Fr.)Arun Antony, who serves as the Director of CMI House, Lavasa, and holds the position of Dean of Studies at Christ Institute of

Management, Lavasa, initiated his discourse by introducing the fundamental concept of Cultural Dynamics. Father shared several crucial elements necessary for the establishment of the Institute's culture. Using a structured questionnaire, we identified three prevailing factors for our Institute's Cultural Development: Caring, Learning, and Process.

In the subsequent session, Dr. (Fr.)Arun Antony distinguished between the learning models of the 20th and 21st centuries. He placed significant emphasis on experiential learning rather than experimental learning, delving into the Flip Classroom model. He highlighted the necessity of learning for the acquisition of skills rather than mere information.



Day 4 - The last day of FDP was on the topic Learning Management System (LMS) training with the primary objective of equipping the team implemented LMS. Throughout the training program, various aspects of the LMS were comprehensively addressed. These topics encompassed attendance management, students feedback, leave application and navigation through the platform. A key emphasis was placed on the LMS's pivotal role in streamlining administrative tasks, enhancing communication, and creating opportunities for professional development.

The training spanned a period of five days and incorporated a combination of presentations, hands-on exercises, and dedicated Q&A sessions. This approach ensured active engagement with the system and provided participants with the means to address any uncertainties or queries that arose.





Conclusion

The successful completion of our four-day Faculty Development Program (FDP) on the topic of "Leveraging Moodle in a Culturally Diverse Classroom: Strategies for Effective Teaching" marks a significant milestone in our pursuit of educational excellence.
